

NOVEMBER GARDENING TIPS *Fall Is The BEST Time to Plant!*

PLANT:

- Trees, shrubs, vines, ornamental grass, etc. now so they can get well established by next summer's heat.
- Annuals & Perennials Pansies, violas, ornamental cabbage/kale, cyclamen, snapdragons, dianthus, dusty miller, salvia, skullcap, blackfoot daisy, heuchera & more. Dig, divide & replant spring blooming perennials.
- **Spring-flowering bulbs**. **Refrigerate tulips & Dutch hyacinths** for at least 45 days at 45° and plant after mid-December. Daffodils and grape hyacinths can be planted as soon as you buy them.
- Annual or perennial ryegrass and fescue seed early in the month for green grass all winter. **PRUNE:**
- Perennials by removing dead foliage. Mulch over those that die back to the ground for added protection.
- Shrubs as needed to reshape and remove dead branches—save major pruning for late winter.
- **Trees** as needed to remove dead or damaged limbs—prune major limbs in late fall/early winter. Remove unwanted surface roots—limit removal to 1 or 2 significant roots each year. Good time to prune **oak trees** to avoid Oak Wilt problems.
- **Tropical plants** you want to move indoors for the winter. **Spray with <u>Ferti.lome Triple Action, or use</u>** <u>systemic insect drench or granules, or drench root ball with a mild orange oil solution first</u>, then move inside before temperatures reach the mid-40's.

WATER:

- Potted plants & flower beds as needed; shrubs & trees less often in cool weather, but deeply to produce hardier, better rooted plants. Water before forecasted frosts or freezing temperatures to reduce damage to plants and trees. *It's a good time to install drip irrigation or call Covington's to do it for you (LI0021683).*
- To improve water retention in your plantings, add <u>Soil Moist</u> & <u>Expanded Shale</u>, or <u>Covington's Soil</u> <u>Builder</u> which contains compost, greensand, and expanded shale (holds 38% of its weight in water). <u>Covington's Soil Builder</u> also breaks up clay, adds nutrients, & revitalizes microbial activity.
- Top dress landscape and flower beds with a 2-3 inch layer of <u>mulch</u> to help retain moisture, reduce weeds & maintain soil temperature. The average first freeze occurs in our area in mid-November, so have <u>frost</u> <u>cloth</u> on hand to protect tender plants.
- Trees installed for less than two years must have special care to ensure a strong and healthy root system. See our Plant Article, <u>Tree Care for the First Two Years</u> on our website or come by and pick one up.

CONVENTIONAL FERTILIZATION, WEED, DISEASE & PEST CONTROL SOLUTIONS

FERTILIZE:

- Pansies & other annuals w/Covington's Premium Flower & Garden Fertilizer or Hi-Yield Blood & Bone Meal.
- Newly planted trees and shrubs every 3-4 weeks for the first year with **Ferti.lome Root Stimulator**.
- Trees, shrubs, vines, groundcover, perennials with Covington's Special Tree & Shrub Fertilizer.
- Roses with **ferti.lome Rose Food** or **ferti.lome Rose with Systemic Insecticide**.
- Lawn with Covington's Premium Lawn Fertilizer 21-7-14 as last application of the year to prepare for winter.
- Herbs and vegetables with w/<u>Covington's Premium Flower & Garden Fertilizer or ferti.lome Gardeners</u> <u>Special 11-15-11</u>.
- Iron-deficient plants w/Max Green Iron 22/60 or Ferti-lome Soil Acidifier Plus Iron to encourage greening.

WEEDS & DISEASE CONTROL:

• Early to mid-month use **Dimension pre-emergent herbicide** to prevent grassy winter weeds, as well as some broadleaf weeds.

- Spot treat broadleaf weeds such as dandelion, henbit & clover in St. Augustine or Bermuda grass with <u>ferti.lome Weed Free Zone.</u> Spot treat nutsedge and crabgrass with <u>Bonide Sedge Ender</u>.
- Use <u>ferti.lome Systemic Fungicide</u> for powdery mildew, disease & fungi on hawthorn, photinias, roses, etc.
- Keep fallen leaves off your lawn—they compact and trap moisture which can lead to turf diseases. Apply
 <u>ferti.lome F-Stop</u> to St. Augustine for fungal infections including Take All Patch and Brown Patch. For added
 protection, spread ½ inch layer of <u>Canadian Brown Sphagnum Peat Moss</u> on infected area & water in.
- Continue spray program for fruit and nut trees with <u>ferti.lome Triple Action</u> or <u>Bonide Fruit Tree Spray</u>.

INSECT & PEST CONTROL:

- Control aphids, spider mites, mealy bugs, thrips & other problem insects with **Bonide Systemic Insecticide**.
- For caterpillars & cankerworms, use ferti.lome Borer & Tent Caterpillar Killer.
- Use <u>Hi-Yield Grub Free Zone II</u> for grub & cinch bug control.
- To control fire ant mounds/infestations, use *ferti.lome Come and Get It*.
- Use Hi-Yield Slug & Snail Killer or Sluggo Plus with Spinosad to control slugs & snails on flowers & foliage.
- For best control of scale & to kill borers in the trunks of trees, use **Bonide Systemic Insect Drench** which protects for months.
- Use <u>ferti.lome Triple Action</u> or <u>Bonide Fruit Tree Spray</u> for insects on fruit trees and <u>Bird X Netting</u> to protect ripening fruit from birds.

ORGANIC FERTILIZATION, WEED, DISEASE & PEST CONTROL SOLUTIONS

FERTILIZE:

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- Newly planted trees and shrubs with <u>Garrett Juice Pro w/Mycorrhizae & Soil Microbes</u> to help prevent transplant shock, increase beneficial microorganisms, and encourage root development.
- Flowers/perennials w/Happy Frog Fruit and Flower; Roses w/Happy Frog Rose Food.
- Vegetable gardens with Good Natured Make-it-Green 4-1-2 or Happy Frog Tomato & Vegetable fertilizer.
- Turf, shrubs, and trees with <u>Milorganite Organic Nitrogen Fertilizer 5-2-0</u>, or use <u>Happy Frog All Purpose</u> <u>5-5-5</u> for shrubs and trees.
- Use <u>Make it Green 4-1-2</u> on shrubs, trees & turf grass, and existing ryegrass or fescue.
- Use <u>Corn Gluten Meal 9-0-0</u> to feed turf and prevent weeds. Also spread <u>Dry Molasses</u> to enhance weed control and encourage healthy soil.
- Use <u>Ladybug "Sylvan Formula" All-in-One Mulch & Compost Blend</u> with corn meal, molasses & greensand to perk up stressed or damaged plants.
- Apply <u>Garrett Juice Plus</u> once a month to your landscape to increase beneficial micro-organisms in the soil and to reduce the need for water.
- Add <u>**Texas Greensand</u>** for deep greening in lawns, trees and landscape plants.</u>

WEEDS & DISEASE CONTROL:

- Spot treat grassy and broadleaf weeds with <u>20% Vinegar</u>. Add 2 oz. of Orange Oil per gallon of vinegar to enhance the kill on weeds and grasses.
- Apply <u>Horticultural Corn Meal</u> on landscape plants, vegetables, and turf grass for disease control.

INSECT & PEST CONTROL:

- Use <u>ferti.lome Come and Get It Spinosad Bait</u> for protection from fire ants. To treat individual fire ant mounds, use 3 to 4 ounces of <u>Orange Oil</u> per gallon of water as a drench. Spray <u>Orange Oil</u> in areas infested with pillbugs, sow bugs, ants and spiders.
- For army worms, tent caterpillars & cankerworms on shrubs/trees, use Hi-Yield Thuricide at dusk or Spinosad.
- For bugs & fungus use <u>ferti.lome Triple Action Plus</u> containing Neem Oil. Spray <u>Bonide All Season Oil</u> for scale on holly, crape myrtles & fruit trees. *In hot weather, use these oil products in early morning or evening!*
 - Use <u>ferti.lome Triple Action Plus</u> for insects on fruit trees; <u>Bird X Netting</u> to protect ripening fruit from birds.
- Repel mosquitoes with **Bonide Mosquito Beater spray**
- . Use <u>Mosquito Bits</u> with BTI to kill mosquito larvae in standing water & to control fungus gnats in flower beds and containers.
- Control slugs & snails with <u>Bonide Slug Magic or Sluggo Plus w/Spinosad</u>. Use <u>Nature's Guide</u> <u>Diatomaceous Earth</u> for crawling insects and grasshoppers.

• Use eco-friendly <u>Liquid Armadillo Repellant</u> to get rid of armadillos.
